

Order of Operations

- 1. Plug in Router
- 2. Turn on SERVER machine
- 3. Log in to SERVER machine with WINDOWS password
- 4. Connect to "EPollBook" Network on **SERVER** machine. Note that the server may already be connected
- 5. Launch/Open the Badger Book Application on SERVER machine
- 6. Log in to Badger Book
- 7. Turn on client machines
- 8. Log in to client machines with WINDOWS password
- 9. Connect to "EPollBook" Network on client machines (if not already connected)
- 10. Launch/Open the Badger Book Application on client machines
- 11. Log in to Badger Book

Build your Badger Books! The router is plugged in and the servers is on and running. Now put your client machines together.

✓ Navigation: follow the prompts on the screen and practice navigating around the Badger Book application. The instructor will tell you how to begin the EDR process when you get to that point.

- 4. What do you do when your voter doesn't show up on the list in check in? Choose all that apply.

 - b. Select "none of these are my voter" and start an EDR

 - d. Other: what else have you thought of?

- 5. What do you do when the voter address doesn't show up in an EDR?
- 6. You have an absentee ballot in your hand but it doesn't say returned in Badger Book. What do you do?
 - a. Throw it away
 - b. Mark it as rejected and record reason on EL-104
 - c. Process it because you have it so it is returned
 - d. Check it in under the voter as in-person voter
- 7. What do you do when you have an absentee ballot that doesn't show up on absentee list at all?
 - a. Verify it has clerk initials and is for this election, then check it in in supplemental poll list
 - b. Check it in under the voter in the in-person check in
 - c. Reject it because it is clearly fraudulent
 - d. Throw it away and pretend you never saw it

Badger Books in the Polling Place

- ✓ Test, test, test
- ✓ ePollbook is not separated by alphabet or ward allowing additional flexibility
- ✓ Devices need power source, be mindful of cord placement

Expectations

- ✓ Badger Books are only a poll book
- ✓ They are not connected to the internet
- ✓ No Personally Identifiable Information (PII) is included. It's the same info as the paper poll book.
- ✓ Some processes will still need to be done on paper (including but not limited to):
 - Paper copy of poll book
 - Ineligible voter list
 - Addressing aids
 - Supplemental (Election Day) Poll List (EL-107): <u>https://elections.wi.gov/wec-form/supplemental-poll-list</u>
 - Inspectors' Statement (EL-104)
 - Challenge Documentation (EL-104c)
 - Election Observer Log (EL-109)
 - Provisional Ballot Reporting Forms (EL-123 & EL-123r)

Security

- ✓ Each user (election inspector) has a unique username and password that must be used when working on the Badger Book pollbook
- ✓ The Badger Book uses encryption and authentication to communicate via the router

Networking

- ✓ What is a server? What is a client?
- ✓ Server is the brain
- ✓ Server shares data with clients
- ✓ Backs up every 5 minutes
- ✓ Client receives and sends data to the server using the router

 - b. Have the son sign the paper supplemental and document the issue in the EL-104.
 - c. Call the clerk and refer the father to the District Attorney. This is clearly fraud.
 - d. Let the son sign as the father.
- 10. A voter comes in and refuses to sign the Badger Book in check in. What do you do? Choose all that apply.
 - a. Tell them as nicely as possible that the statute is clear: if they don't sign, they don't get a ballot
 - b. Let them sign the backup paper version of the poll book
 - c. Sign for them and let them get their ballot
 - d. Tell them "this is how we do it now". They are welcome to consider voting absentee in the future
